However, the top of the pictures are secured by locking nuts and bolts and




Clearly someone rather likes Eamonn Murphy's work. If so we wish that they would go online and buy the pictures that they like rather than try to steal them.

PLATFORM ONE - FORMER DOME


Those of you who are long enough in the tooth may well recall that many years ago there was a dome above the stairs running from street level up to Platform One (see the left hand side of the picture below).



Unfortunately, the dome was removed by British Rail to be replaced by a flat roof, which now lets in water as if it were a colander.

So we are delighted to see that scaffolding etc. has been erected to facilitate roof repair work so as to try and redress the flow of water.

As can be seen there is currently some heavy ponding on the stairs when it rains.



So the work being undertaken is very much appreciated.

dome. That would look great as well as being able to let in lots of natural light so as to brighten up the stairs.

One of our next purchases will be a large number of daffodil bulbs which we will plant along the top of the wall by the Waiting Room Garden in time to bloom next spring.

STEAM TRAIN - SATURDAY 5TH JUNE

We would like to thank one of our members, Alan Prentice, who contacted us recently to say that he had seen an advert placed by www.railwaytouring.net promoting a steam special "The Scarborough Flyer".

The Scarborough Flyer is scheduled to travel from Manchester Victoria to Scarborough (via the Hope Valley) on Saturday 5th June.

However, the abseil was rearranged and took place on Sunday 25th April.


